booklets and Viva-Voce booklets, in the context of complying with standards prescribed, has been critically looked into, by the Hon'ble High Court and in several Writ proceedings. The Hon'ble Courts, noticing aberrations in some cases, have ordered 'to re-conduct' the Practical / Viva Examinations, primarily based on the lacunae identified in the marking system or, violation of the instructions from the University authorities. The academic experts at the University having examined and deliberated, it was noticed, lacunae referred to were primarily, due to 'marks awarded' by the individual examiners, not being reflected on Practical/Viva booklets etc., giving rise to the suspicion of regularity in the process. Though, it is understood that, factually there has been a fair and proper evaluation by the qualified and experienced examiners/faculties of the University, apparently because of heavy load of work, there may have been some hasty recording of the assessment made and marks assigned/awarded, by evolving their own process, not in terms of instructions by the registrar's [evaluations] offices. In the light of these it is considered as necessary to address these issues and make the system more workable and transparent. Having examined the entire process and considering it as necessary; a new ordinance to replace the earlier operating provisions.

He informed the members that University has ordinance for Theory valuations but did not have any Ordinance governing the conduct of Practical/Clinical and Viva voce examinations. He also informed that there was a need to ensure capturing of the marks provided by the examiners in practical/clinical and viva voce online portal and reducing dependency on entering the marks in the booklets provided.

At present the Examiners need to ensure that the marks awarded by them for each candidate to be entered in the freezed copy, unfreezed copy, compilation sheet and also on the Practical/Clinical and Viva answer booklets. This is leading to duplication of work by the examiners. To avoid such duplication of work, the Registrar(Evaluation) proposed to bring-in an ordinance governing conduct of practical examinations and to get the marks entered only the freezed copy and on the compilation sheet and there was a need to get these signed sheets uploaded in the online portal of RGUHS.

There was a need to update the RGUHS online portal and modify the practical answer booklets. He requested the members to deliberate and decide on the above two issues.

The Dean of Faculty of Medicine, informed the Committee that RGUHS should ensure fair and transparent conduct of examinations and utilized the technology available for capturing the marks awarded by the Examiners in the online portal thereby reducing the manual work done by the Examiners. On the day of surprise inspection, Principal, Vice Principal, Teaching Faculties were not physical present. Two Clinical Instructors are present and they were not ready to reveal the information about college.</li> <li>3. College building (Infrastructure) is nearly 4000Sqft and which is shared with GNM, DMLT programme. Poor and fragile building present with 4000sqft, as per RGUHS norms 23200sqft is required for B.Sc Nursing Programme. Massive shortage of teaching staff, college infrastructure and clinical facilities (No Clinical Facilities provided).</li> <li>4. Teaching staff attendance was not given for verification, as it was not maintained and was not available.</li> <li>5. Records of salary acquittance, staff attendance register was asked for verification &amp; it was not maintained.</li> <li>6. Even after repeatedly requesting for records &amp; documents, Management was not ready to produce.</li> <li>7. The class room without basic facilities were shared with GNM &amp; DMLT Students (General Nursing Midwifery course).</li> <li>8. No laboratories were maintained in the college.</li> <li>9. No hostel facilities available.</li> <li>10. Parent hospital &amp; clinical facilities not available.</li> <li>11. There is no quality parameters maintained to run nursing college.</li> <li>12. The college authority was not cooperative &amp; did not reveal any details &amp; did not provide any required documents on the day of inspection.</li> <li>13. Library facilities not available.</li> <li>14. HPR College of Nursing, Principal submitted a letter to Registrar, RGUHS on 22/07/2024 stating that RGUHS Surprise inspection team visited college campus at 1:00 PM after closing hours of the college ( Saturday 20.07.2024).</li> <li>15. Inspected team Submitted GPS Map, camera photograph with students in class room showing the time of 12.40 PM on 20/07/2024</li> <li>16. **There is court case going on between the 2 trusts namely Koramangala Kala -Niketan Education Society and Prime Group of Institution and Charitable Trust in W.P.No: 2676/2023, hence, surprise inspection was conducted.**

1. Koramangala Kala -Niketan Education Society applied for starting new nursing college and was sanctioned Kala - Niketan college of nursing in the year of 2003-04 Academic year.
2. But at present Prime Group of Institution and Charitable Trust is claiming that they have purchased the college and it is in the ownership of Prime Group of Institution and Charitable Trust from 26.02.2018 (at the time of inspection document has been produced)
3. Selling of the college trust is against the rules and regulation of RGUHS /INC .(There is Sale of trust)
4. There is no transparency in college trust / Society management and it is in ambiguity.
5. **Clinical facility:**
  - o Sri Arogya Hospital -30 beds (As per INC norms it is below 50 beds -cannot be considered for teaching hospital)
  - o Prime life hospital -35 beds (As per INC norms it is below 50 beds -cannot be considered for teaching hospital)
  - o Aster Whitefield Hospital -300 beds (MOU copy not Produced and Aster Whitefield Hospital clinical facilities is utilized by other colleges also)
  - o Sakra World Hospital -500 beds (MOU copy not Produced and Sakra World Hospital clinical facilities is utilized by other colleges also)
  - o Narayana Hrudayalaya -330 Beds (MOU copy not Produced and they have own college of Nursing).
  - o Spandana Hospital-300 beds it is Psychiatric hospital.
6. Teaching faculty: they have only 3 M.Sc faculty on the day of inspection and 10 Nursing tutor/clinical instructors were present (Total comes 13 faculties)
7. There is 50% of Teaching faculties shortage.
8. Principal's KSNC certificate not renewed.
9. Some of the Faculties Degree Certificate is not produced.
10. Vehicle document was not given and physically it was not there in campus or in hospital premises.
11. Infrastructure: the produced Xerox copy of lease agreement of the college building dated 15.06.2018 seems fake- it is not registered copy. Tax paid receipt not produced. There is no clear documents submitted relating to college building like approved Building blue print, latest tax paid receipt.

**Due to above deficiencies, college is not recommended and being instructed not to make admissions for 2024-25 AY.**



Health Sciences. The format of the question papers is in accordance with the ordinances of the relevant courses as per respective Apex Body regulations. Descriptive questions make up the majority of the exam questions. There are very few courses that combine descriptive and multiple-choice questions (MCQs).

As the 'written questions' tests higher order cognitive processes, in a manner that multiple-choice questions cannot, and consequently have higher validity and as the Long Essay, Short Essay, Short Answers are considered to be superior at 'testing' higher cognitive levels of knowledge and has greater validity particularly in the courses of High Education related to Health Sciences, the University is conducting its theory examinations with most of the questions in descriptive written format. Wherever, the apex body norms prescribe for objective type of question, the University has implemented MCQ questions and providing Key Answers for the purpose of evaluation.

Under RGUHS, there are around 3000+ question paper codes for different courses. Additionally, the university will produce a minimum of ten sets of question papers for each code of the question papers. Furthermore, framing the model answers for "the descriptive essay type questions" is challenging, especially in the health science courses. For this reason, the Key Answers for "subjective type answers" in health science course examinations are not being offered.

At present, University is providing Key Answers for MCQ questions wherever the MCQ pattern questions are there. Even for this small segment, University is receiving queries on the Key Answers referring to various sources of information/text books. In such situations, there would be a significant number of queries, if the key answers or Model answer is implemented for descriptive type of questions.

However, University is witnessing that many students are filing writ petition before the Hon'ble Courts seeking Key-Answers or Model Answers even for Descriptive type of questions. The university must have a clear stand regarding the provision of Key-Answers or Model Answers for questions that are descriptive.

Hence, the subject is placed before the Academic Council in its meeting to be held on 11.06.2024 for deliberation and decision regarding providing key answer to descriptive type of questions in Health Science Courses being conducted under RGUHS.

<b>Deliberation:</b>	<p>Academic council constituted by the experts across the different faculties deliberated this issue in length and the Academic council has discussed as follows:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. There is always <b>multiple way of presenting the knowledge</b> and innovative approaches will be deprived of marks if we restrict to key answers. The current assessment pattern with multiple assessors has reduced the chances of any individual idiosyncrasies of an examiner influencing the results of a student</li><li>2. <b>Keywords</b> are the words and phrases that people use in search engines/articles to find what they're looking for. The keywords for a particular question set by a qualified expert may not always match with the other experts. The students themselves may challenge the given keywords depending on his varied source of knowledge or learning as stated above. Each student reads from a textbook of his choice and there are multiple authors. This may lead to multiple disputes regarding to correctness of the keywords by both students and faculty.</li><li>3. <b>'Are we failing the system by passing the students'</b> is a concern. If a student presents an answer based on the most recent knowledge based on journal articles and if the key answer does not feature it, imagine the loss to that student. Medicine is an eclectic field with new knowledge coming in everyday and the shelf life of gold standards is drastically reducing. If we force key answers then various sticky issues are expected to stare at, as a result of formation of specific patterns as explained by Complex adaptive systems.</li><li>4. The students are expected to know about <b>recent advances</b> and their learning receives inputs from vast and varied sources such as text books, reference books, online free learning search engines, journal articles, newsletters and updates from international health agencies. The Learning as per the curriculum/syllabus for health science students is dynamic due to changing nature of subject</li><li>5. Rather than asking questions from the lower levels of <b>Bloom's Taxonomy</b> which encourage rote learning (recall), LAQs and SAQs are asked from the higher levels such as comprehension, application, analysis, synthesis and evaluation.</li><li>6. Medical problems often have <b>multiple valid approaches and solutions</b>. Providing a key answers can imply there is only one correct way to address an issue, which is not reflective of real-world medical practice where diverse approaches are often required</li><li>7. The medical field requires professionals who can think on their feet, adapt to new information, and apply</li></ol>

Training that relies on key answers does not adequately prepare students for the complexities and uncertainties of medical practice.</p> <p><b>Hinders Critical Thinking:</b> Long essay questions are intended to assess a student's ability to think critically and develop their own reasoned responses. Key answers limit this by suggesting there is only one correct way to address the question.</p> <p>8. Overall, avoiding the use of key answers for long essay questions promotes a more robust, equitable, and practical learning environment in medical education</p> <p>9. <b>If rote learning is encouraged by giving key answers to the long and short essays, then the goals described by the various apex bodies will not be achieved, because the student will have a knowledge that the key answers are the only way to solve the clinical conditions.</b></p>

Hence, letter was sent to take opinion from Dean, Faculty of ISM in consultation with the Chairman in BOS in Ayurveda (PG) and subject expert.
