#### II. Description of the course

#### 1. Introduction to the course

Teaching is an independent discipline, having its own philosophical environment and practice evidences. To become a teacher, one needs to be aware of the basic concepts of not only teaching methods, but also of understanding and assessing the learners. This fact is equally applicable to disciplines like healthcare professionals' education. However, it is seen that there are very little opportunities for these professionals to acquire competencies as teachers in a formal and controlled atmosphere. Therefore, a formal course in health professionals' education is becoming an essential credential for today's health professionals' education leaders.

Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka, has experimented over the past sixteen years, a formal method of training healthcare professionals to become competent teachers. These efforts were spread over individual institutions or a discipline. Gaining from these experiences, it is now proposed to offer a formal course of training in educational methods that would encompass the entire spectrum of competencies that contribute for excellence in education.

It is therefore proposed to start a module-based course on Blended Learning (BL) Platform to generate competent human resources to lead the future of healthcare education. This course aims to provide theoretical and conceptual insights into the fundamentals of health professionals' education, build their capacity to identify needs of specific groups, provide adequate and appropriate learning environment and opportunities, assess objectively the learning outcomes, provide directions for the professional growth of the future health professionals' educators, and enable them to plan policies and engage in advocacy for evidence-based healthcare education.

The course is organised into modules, each carrying credits appropriate to the magnitude of their impact. The course shall be implemented with distance learning through text / electronic based self-learning resources. These are reinforced by a continuous facility of mentorship from the RGUHS Academic & Administrative Training Institute (RAATI). There will be regular contact programs at the University Centre to assess the continuous learning activity and also provide for interaction with mentors and peer groups.

Submit the duly filled application form along with the Demand Draft of Rs. 2000/- (Rupees two thousand only) drawn in favour of **Registrar**, **RGUHS**, along with attested copies of UG, PG, and BCEM/SCEM certificates, caste certificate to claim reservation, and No Objection Certificate from the Head of Institution in hard copy, in duplicate, through proper channel to the Registrar, Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, 4<sup>th</sup> 'T' Block, Jayanagar, Bengaluru on or before the notified last date for the admission batch.

#### V. Criteria for admission

The following are the criteria for selection of candidates to undergo the Fellowship in Health Professionals Education under the RAATI:

#### 1. Eligibility.

To be eligible for selection, the applicant shall –

- a. be a permanent and full-time faculty not below the rank of Associate Professor in an institution affiliated to the RGUHS, and having both UG, and PG programs.
- b. have at least 10 years of residual service.
- c. have postgraduate qualification in any of the health professionals' course.
- d. have obtained Certificate from any of the RGUHS conducted program in educational methodology, such as BCEM or SCEM.
- e. commit to provide training related services at university, and affiliated institutions, as per the university's needs.
- f. NOT be holding any PG level certificate / diploma or higher qualifications in educational methodology (to provide opportunity for those who do not have such qualification).

#### 2. Selection process:

- a. Call for applications RAATI calls for the application through a notification. The notification will be hosted on the RGUHS Website at least 30 working days before the date of entrance test.
- b. The applications will be screened for eligibility of the applicants as per the stated criteria, and shortlist the eligible candidates. The shortlisted candidates will be intimated through their registered email, and the list will also be hosted on the university website under RAATI section.
- c. The date for entrance test will be finalized with approval from the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, and informed to all the eligible candidates and also notified in the university website.
- d. The entrance test will be conducted as paper-based test with MCQs for 100 Marks. The written test shall be conducted for 180 minutes at a place designated by the Evaluation Section of the University.
- e. The candidates' score of written examination will be notified by the Evaluation Section of University within five working days after the completion of the entrance test.

#### 3. Description of Entrance Test:

- a. The entrance test will be on-site test for 100 marks, to assess the knowledge, and aptitude for basics of educational methodology, such as learning theories, educational objectives, communication, instructional methods, instructional media, student assessment, and educational research.
- b. The distribution of weightage will be knowledge-based MCQs for 70 marks, and Scenario-based MCQs for 30 marks.
- c. The knowledge-based MCQs carry one mark each, and the Scenario-based MCQs carry two marks each. There will be a 50% negative marking for every wrong answer. There will be no negative marking for the unanswered questions.
- d. The content for entrance test will include theories of learning; professionalism including teacher roles; tools for educational planning, implementation, and assessment such as Bloom's taxonomy, Guilbert's layers; instructional methods and media as relevant to health professionals; and principles of

assessment, tools of assessment as appropriate for health professionals' education; professionalism of university level teachers, basics of research, leadership, and management.

The candidate in such instances pay re-registration fee (as per the registration fee), and the other fee except the admission, and convocation fee. The tuition fee is calculated as Rs. 15,000/- (Rupees fifteen thousand only) for each six-month block. The maximum time permitted to complete is double the course duration.
